MEDICAL BILLING & CODING SPECIALIST PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Program Objective

The objective of the Medical Billing & Coding Specialist Program is to train students for an entry level position as a medical billing specialist, medical coding specialist, and/or a variety of positions in the health information field. Graduates of the program will possess the skills needed to successfully perform medical office procedures such as medical keyboarding & coding, medical billing, clinical documentation improvement, medical auditing, healthcare compliance, revenue cycle management, practice management, health care records management, process medical insurance, follow healthcare laws & ethics and procedures.

Program Length

The Medical Billing and Coding Specialist Program is a total of 1152 clock hours. Full-time students will complete the program in 32 weeks. Part-time students will complete the program within 64 weeks.
